About the Speaker:

Glenn Frankel is Director of the School of Journalism and G.B. Dealey Regents Professor at the University of Texas at Austin. He spent 27 years as a Washington Post reporter, editor and foreign correspondent, and served as bureau chief in Southern Africa, London and Jerusalem, where he won the 1989 Pulitzer Prize for International Reporting for his "sensitive and balanced coverage" of Israel and the Palestinian uprising. He is the author of books on Israel and the apartheid era in South Africa, and has a new book coming out next February on the true story behind John Ford's classic Western film *The Searchers*, starring John Wayne. He came to UT Austin in 2010 after four years as a visiting professor of journalism at Stanford University.

Directions to Green Pastures Restaurant:

From Mopac


Exit Caesar Chavez (First Street), head east. Turn right (south) onto Guadalupe Bridge across Lady Bird Lake. Cross the bridge and the street becomes South First Street. Take South First 1.5 miles past the bridge to Live Oak. Turn right (west) onto Live Oak Head west 3 blocks. Green Pastures is on the left.

From I35

Exit Oltorf and head west. Take Oltorf to South First Street Turn right (north) on South First. Turn left (west) at the next light (Live Oak). Take Live Oak 3 blocks west. Green Pastures is on the left.

From 290/71

Exit South First Street and head north. Take South First Street to Live Oak (about a mile and a half). Turn left (west) onto Live Oak. Take Live Oak 3 blocks west. Green Pastures is on the left.
